Jennifer Holland-Brewer once again produced an amazing performance in the lead role of Reno Sweeney and was supported by a great cast with Nick Harris

as Billy Crocker, Louise Cannon as Hope Harcourt, Nick Toop as Lord Oakleigh, Luke Whitchurch as Moonface Martin and Charlie Wood as Erma.

But the entire cast played its part in putting on an amazing run at the Octagon Theatre from March 27 to April 1.
